Honorary Life Membership Criteria (HLM)

- 1) Honorary Life Membership may be conferred for outstanding service to the objects and aims of the Association.
- 2) Nominations and citations for candidates for Honorary Life Membership shall be passed to the incumbent Branch and Association Masters for consideration before being passed to the Association Management Committee for final consideration.
- 3) Honorary Life Membership is an honour awarded to people who have made a significant contribution to the life of the Association. A proposal cannot just be based on long service.
- 4) There is no requirement for HLM's to be made each year
- 5) The proposer should include in their citation why they think the person they are nominating deserves the recognition.
- 6) Nominations will only be considered for the next Annual General Meeting if they are made prior to the November AMC meeting
- 7) No impromptu nominations from the floor will be allowed at the Annual General Meeting.
- 8) It is a tradition of the Association that the nomination is kept secret and the potential recipient is not informed prior to the AGM where the honour is presented
- 9) Blank Honorary Life Membership Certificates are currently held by David Llewellyn, and the calligraphy on the certificate is prepared by Myra Jenkins of Llandaff Cathedral.
