A Full Peal is a special bell-ringing performance, lasting about 3 hours and starting and finishing with the bells striking "rounds," all the bells in order from the highest to the lowest.

Ringing a Full Peal takes a lot of concentration – every bell strikes every time with no opportunity to take a break.

All the bells are rung at least 5000 times, each time the "row" or "change" (sequence in which they are rung) is different from the last, for example;

12345

21354

23145

32415

32451

Etc.

If more than 7 bells are being used in the pattern each order of the bells will be different.

If less than 7 bells are being used in the pattern, sequences are repeated to make up the required length, with each sequence being rung an equal number of times.

Full peals are rung for many reasons; To celebrate or commemorate special events and anniversaries, in memory of people who have died, to extend the capabilities of the ringers, and just for fun!!
